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
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

DBSV – Deutscher Blinden- und Sehbehindertenverband e.V.

Setbehindermethand e.v. of the COVID-19-Pandemic on tourism and on the tourism activities of the DBSV accessible tourism remains an important issue for the organisation. It covers all aspects of accessible mobility and is — according to articles 9 and 30 of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities — an indispensable element of inclusion.

The Covid-19-Pandemic resulted in additional difficulties for blind and partially sighted travellers because, for example, assistance services were not resp. not sufficiently available. Moreover, many conferences and expert meetings in which DBSV used to participate were cancelled or, at the best, postponed and/or carried out virtually.

The "Accessible Tourism Day" that has been carried out during the ITB International Travel Fair Berlin annually since 2012, an event by which a huge audience of tourism professionals could be addressed was not cancelled as in 2020, but took place on March 12th 2021 as video conference. Its main subject in 2021 were challenges and opportunities for accessible travelling caused by the Covid-19-Pandemic.

For the same reason the regular "PRM-Dialogue" established in 2015 by the German Aviation Association in which besides several disability organisations, the German National Association of Senior Citizens, and representatives of airlines and airports are engaged that did not take place in 2020 was carried out as video conference. Despite difficult conditions the DBSV Youth Club and the Youth Network 'VIEWS International' launched a project to develop guidelines for inclusive guided city tours for visually impaired people. The project is financially supported by the European Commission. Partner countries are Belgium, Italy and Turkey.

ISO/DIS 21902 Tourism and related services. Accessible Tourism for All. Requirements and Recommendations.

- In June 2021, the ISO/DIS 21902 Tourism and related services standard was approved. Accessible Tourism for All. For almost 5 years, work has been done to bring this standard to light with the aim of giving the stakeholders of the entire tourism value chain, the recommendations, and requirements so that they know how to make their husinesses accessible
- To disseminate this standard and encourage its use, an online workshop is held on December 9. "Accessible Tourism for all: Standards and Recommendations Guiding the recovery" Organized by the UNWTO, in collaboration with UNE, ENAT and Fundación ONCE. This webinar shed light on the new normative instruments and recommendations by gathering technical experts and featuring good practices in accessible, inclusive tourism. It was aimed at encouraging both public and private sector stakeholders to plan and implement their own accessibility agenda. This webinar wasn't about complying with requirements, but rather about grasping the wealth of opportunities that accessible tourism entails.

Project Way of St. James

Thanks to the Accessible Way of Saint James project, pilgrims with disabilities will be able to walk the Camino de Santiago in a more independent way. The contents of the project's website and the accessible applications will provide the necessary resources for this. The website contains information to prepare the way, information on accessibility and accessible resources, as well as a section on accessible technologies, which contains support apps:

- · IGN helps you to prepare the trip, what to put in the backpack, the difficulty of the route, the weather....
- Blind Explorer, a 3D sound-based orientation app for rural roads.
- Soundscape guides you through the towns and villages you pass through, where to eat, where to sleep, pharmacies, etc. also using 3D sound.

Project Way of St. James

The Camino de Santiago is inclusive and supported by accessible apps, it can be done by everyone.

The aim of the project is to enable people with disabilities to walk the route as independently as possible. But it will not only be for them, all people can benefit from this project, as it is for everyone.

In order to achieve this, the following was done:

- To provide the website with information about accessible resources.
- Diagnosis of the accessibility of the physical facilities: The project website includes information on accessibility. For this purpose, it is necessary to check the accessibility of the hostels along the route.

In order to filter out those hostels that do not meet these requirements, a telephone contact is first made with the existing hostels. Subsequently, after the initial screening, a team of experts will visit the section of the route to verify all these aspects. This visit is necessary as many of the hotel and catering entrepreneurs may be unaware of the accessibility measures available in their establishments.

1. Continuation of the Eurocity of Guadiana 2020 Project





In 2021, the second phase of the project has been developed, through actions aimed at reinforcing with new memberships of tourist establishments to the TUR4all platform and evaluating the tourist resources of the area. Subsequent drafting of a diagnostic report and recommendations.

Following the fieldwork, the "Eurocity of the Guadiana" destination has been created on the platform in both Spanish and Portuguese, and the awards for the accessibility of the different tourist resources that have participated in the project have been created and presented.

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2. Vera Town Council Accessibility Plan



A study of the destination's accessible tourism offer has been carried out, followed by audits and the preparation of reports.

Training actions to raise awareness of accessible tourism and customer service for tourism professionals with accessibility needs.

The actions have been complemented with the preparation of a guide and the creation of tourist experiences and a destination on the TUR4all platform.

3. Turisme Comunitat Valenciana Agreement





The project involves the implementation of the Accessible Tourism Programme of the Valencian Community 2021-2025, which has been developed by carrying out different actions in coordination with the other partner organisations.

Analysis and diagnosis of the situation of accessible tourism in the Valencian Community and preparation of the strategic lines to be developed within the 2021-2025 programme.

- -> Awareness-raising and training for the tourism sector.
- -> Promotion in TUR4all and awarding of accessible tourism badgesto the resources that have participated in the study.
- → Support for the promotion of accessible tourism through the creation of accessible tourism experiences in the Valencia Region.
- Support in the consolidation of the accessibility axis in the Valencian Community's ITD Model.
- Revision and updating of the Manuals of Good Practices in Accessible Tourism in the Valencian Community.
- Production of a publication of recommendations on accessibility in the context of COVID-19.

7. Strategic Plan for Accessible Tourism on the Costa del Sol Axarquía





The main objective of the project has been to promote a series of specific initiatives to improve accessible tourism in the Costa del Sol Axarquia destination.

To this end, different activities have been developed:



 Analysis of the accessibility of the destination's tourist offer: includes analysis of tourist resources, drafting of accessibility reports and recommendation reports.

- Design and development of the participatory process of strategic reflection, through the elaboration and sending of surveys and the carrying out of different interviews with agents of the tourism sector and representatives of entities of people with local accessibility needs.
- Diagnosis of the destination. SWOT analysis.
- Training actions on accessible tourism.
- · Design of the strategy and Operational Plan.
- Promotional actions on the TUR4all platform for resources, establishments and the destination.
- Preparation of a guide to accessible beaches on the Costa del Sol.

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8. Accessible Passion Roads



The project involves carrying out an accessibility diagnosis of the tourist offer on the accessibility of the route comprising ten villages with history, in the centre of Andalusia, to learn about their heritage, traditions, gastronomy and natural environment.

In all of them, the tradition of their Easter Week celebrations stands out, as an example of the important legacy they possess.

The following actions have been carried out:

- Identification and creation of a database of tourist resources in the municipalities along the route.
- Preparation of a diagnostic report and recommendations on universal accessibility.
- Creation and publication on the online platform www.tur4all.com, of different experiences that include the resources that meet the minimum accessibility requirements, as well as the design of the accessible
- Destination Passion Roads".

The destination trip has been preganised assess the board; rorganised through the tourism and spa holiday







The project consisted of producing a practical and brief publication "Accessible Madrid for you" with the aim of facilitating the planning of the trip and the visit to the city of Madrid for tourists with accessibility needs, or even improvisation at the destination. The publication is distributed in paper format at Madrid Destino tourist offices and at trade fairs and congresses in which it participates. 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10. Accessible mycological trails Salarca-Predif



Consultancy and advice for the design and signposting with universal accessibility criteria of 2 mycological routes and infrastructures with accessible equipment (car parks, accessible toilets, information, explanatory and interpretative panels).

The project has been completed with the drafting of technical reports on both accessibility and recommendations, according to Predif's methodology.








15. Resource analysis Manacor



The project consisted of carrying out a diagnosis of the accessibility of the tourist offer in the municipality of Manacor, with the creation of a database of the tourist offer for the identification of different resources and their analysis for the selection of those with the best accessibility conditions. The reports have been published on the TUR4all Accessible Tourism Platform. With the set of establishments, the destination has been created and accessible tourism experiences have been designed.



Throughout the execution of the project, PREDIF has offered an accessibility consultancy service to the managers of the tourism resources analysed who have requested adaptations to their facilities. This has been carried out by means of telephone or e-mail consultations.

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16. Accessibility analysis and training Benidorm



The project is divided into two distinct actions:

On the one hand, the universal accessibility diagnosis of two tourist resources has been carried out:

→ L'Aigüera Park, analysis and preparation of the technical report on accessibility and indication of recommendations for improvement.

Diagnosis of universal accessibility of Avda. Mediterráneo, indicating recommendations for improvement.

Advice on universal accessibility throughout the process

On the other hand, several training actions have been carried out on accessible tourism and attention to customers with disabilities and other accessibility needs aimed at municipal technicians and other professionals in the sector.

A peculiar exhibition project with more than 50 spaces in 8 different countries, as it does not have a single headquarters, but is an "extended", "diffuse" and global museum. Its aim "is to highlight the people, companies and destinations that have laid the foundations of the world of travel, thus paying tribute to those who have gone before us".

The standard describes basic, common minimum functional requirements and recommendations, applicable across the full spectrum of the built environment, for an accessible and usable built environment, following the Design for All/Universal Design principles which will facilitate equitable and safe use for a wide range of users, including persons with disabilities.
